### Moral Majority called 'primarily political'

"The Moral Majority is primarily political and not religious" and expects its issues to draw hundreds of thousands or millions of otherwise nonpolitical voters to the polls in 1982's congressional elections, its vice president declared here last night.

Cal Thomas told a UCSB audience that it was no accident the organization, headed by fundamentalist preacher Jerry Falwell, surfaced to play an important role in the 1980 election. Events that angered liberals and conservatives alike inevitably gave life to Falwell's group, said Thomas, who gave the students this outline of its

"Our people, the so-called New Right, had not been involved in politics prior to the 1980 election. Many had not even bothered to vote . . . but a series of events blasted them from their chairs of apathy - Vietnam, Watergate, abortion on demand, discrimination against persons whose world view is based on transcendant religious principles.

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Thomas spoke as part of a class on religion and politics. A week earlier, the several hundred persons enrolled heard former Democratic Sen. George McGovern, who lost his seat in 1980 in part because of opposition from religious-oriented groups, contend the relig-

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and said Falwell will announce on his televised gospel hour this Sunday a program to do that.

Thomas also said Moral Majority accepts abortion in one case — to save the life of a mother.

—"We favor and support the traditional family, the husband-wife relationship. It does not mean we are against working mothers or day-care centers."

He said while the organization opposes homosexuality, "I would be opposed — as would Jerry Falwell — to any witch hunt, police breaking down doors, trying to interrupt what consenting adults are doing in private. However, we do believe in standing against laws that would grant (homosexuals) special civil rights."

He added that Moral Majority supports the right of homosexuals to teach in public schools, as long as they don't flaunt their sexual preference.

—"We are pro-moral. Out of this umbrella comes our opposition to the attempt to legalize illegal drugs and our opposition to the spread of pornography. Community standards are the best basis for determining what is acceptable and what is unacceptable in a community."

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"The problem today is not that we have exchanged the Judeo-Christian ethic for another ethic. The problem is that we have left the Judeo-Christian ethic for no ethic, and we are adrift on a sea of moral relativity."

Thomas denied that Moral Majority opposes sex education in public schools, but said it must be taught from a perspective of right and wrong and not in a moral vacuum where "we are in a supermarket and we're pushing our carts down the aisles of morality: Over here we select a can of bisexuality and over there a bottle of pre-marital sex and over there a jar of extra-marital sex."

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
